

## Procedure to Apply for ANKC Recognition of a Breed for Herding

Adopted July 2006

Applicants must be financial members of an ANKC affiliate body.

Only applications for ANKC recognised pure breeds can be submitted.

Applications are to be made to the ANKC Administrator who will forward them to the ANKC Herding Committee for recommendation. Final acceptance will be by the ANKC Governing Council.

Note that electronic submissions are more readily forwarded, but are not essential.

Applicants are to make a case by demonstrating that there is a history of herding in the development of the breed concerned using one or more of the following methods:

 Draw attention to the ANKC Breed Standard for the breed concerned when it includes reference to herding, regardless of the Breed Group the breed is included in.

- Submit a Breed Standard from overseas that includes reference to herding in the breeds development, and as much supporting information as possible.
- Submit confirmation and support from any Australian or overseas Association/Club that recognises the breed as having a herding history.
- Submit copies of any historical references that support the breed's herding history.
- 5) Personal references may also be of value when backed up with sufficient other details as above.
